#### **Opening of the New Telepresence Classroom in H-L Library's Media Commons**



# **3D Printing Comes to the Hatch Science Library**

Thanks to a collaboration among staff from the Library, IT, and Academic Technology & Consulting, a 3D printer has been installed in the Hatch Science Library. Accessible to all members of the Bowdoin community, the LulzBot TAZ 6 printer will make it possible for any student to experiment with 3D printing, previously available only in conjunction with coursework. A variety of resources for free patterns are available, as well as software to generate the code to create a model.

Enjoy refreshments and watch the printer in action, learn about the process, examine recently-created objects, or make a move with one of the Library's printed chess pieces.
