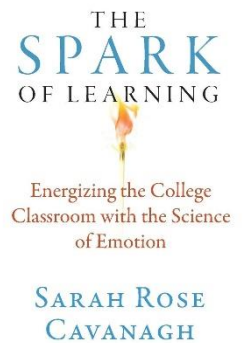

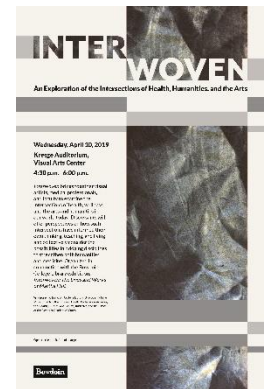
### Interwoven: An Exploration of the Intersections of Health, Humanities, and the Arts
