Library Annex Now Open

Following several years of planning, we are thrilled to announce the opening of the Library Annex. Just a short distance from campus, the Annex is equipped with state-of-the-art environmental controls set at 55 degrees and 30% relative humidity and high-density shelving, allowing for the safe, secure storage of some 200,000 volumes. The facility has enabled us to reunite collection materials in Brunswick that were stored offsite in various locations over the past 15 years, including in Connecticut and at Colby College. It will also support the library's growing collections and help



address preservation needs for fragile formats, such as acidic newsprint and older AV materials.

Materials shelved at the Annex are easily retrieved using the request link in CBBcat, and are available to ILL patrons. Items are paged and delivered to campus daily, Monday-Friday, with a 24-hour turnaround time. Expanded Access to Maine Libraries

The Bowdoin Library has joined a new state-wide borrowing initiative spearheaded by the <u>Maine State Library</u> and <u>Maine Infonet</u>. Launched in September, the <u>Maine Reciprocal Borrowing Program</u> allows anyone with a valid library card from any of the <u>75 participating libraries</u> in the state to



visit and check out materials from any other participating library. The program essentially turns your home library card into a "statewide" card. Borrowed materials may be returned to any participating library and they will be shipped back to the home institution. Bowdoin students, faculty, and staff need only to present their Bowdoin ID at a participating library in order to






