

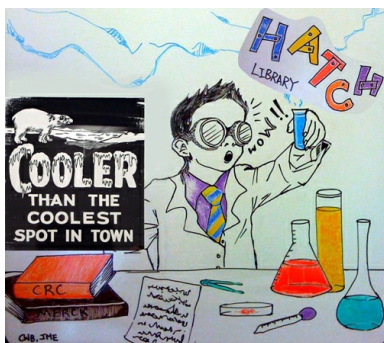

Noteworthy New Resources

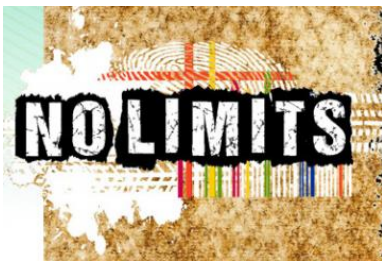
This spring, the library expanded upon its existing holdings in the areas of Native American and Indigenous
