- Bowdoin-held materials for course reserve by January 15th.

Coming in Summer 2023: A New Integrated Library Catalog

At the end of the spring semester, Bowdoin, Colby, and Bates will be retiring the library services platform that is used to manage all library operations, including CBBcat, and will transition to a cloud-based, next generation library system (ILS), Alma/Primo. The new CBBcat, which we expect to launch in mid-June, will provide a more intuitive and responsive search and browse user experience, with integrated access to our print, electronic, and digital materials. Stay tuned for opportunities to preview and test drive the catalog during the spring semester.



Special Collections & Archives Learning Lab

Following a <u>summer-long construction project</u>, September saw the opening of the Learning Lab on the 3rd floor of H-L Library, adjacent to Special Collections & Archives. The Learning Lab provides a dedicated space for SC&A-related instruction and programs and has been a hub of activity throughout the semester, hosting a variety of classes, handson activities for students, and campus-wide events.

New Acquisitions

The library continues to expand its digital resource holdings across disciplines. Recent acquisitions include <u>Political</u>



Extremism & Radicalism in the 20th Century Digital Archive, the GeoScienceWorld ebook collection, the Encyclopedia of Ancient History, the complete archives of <u>Newsweek</u>, the <u>Nation</u>, <u>Architectural Digest</u>, the <u>New Republic</u>, and <u>Life Magazine</u>, and a primary source database focused on <u>North American Immigrant Letters</u>, <u>Diaries</u>, <u>and Oral</u> <u>Histories</u>. Questions about these, or other library resources can be directed to one of our expert <u>Research Librarians</u>.

Among Special Collections & Archives' recent acquisitions are two early editions of the work of Sor Juana Inés de la Cruz, a seventeenthcentury feminist scholar, dramatist, nun, and poet, *Fama y Obras* (1714) and *Obras poeticas* (1715). Both works were consulted extensively this semester by students in Margaret Boyle's course HISP 3231, "Sor Juana and Maria de Zayas: Early Modern Feminisms," and the former was featured in the November 16th Hispanic Feminisms Open House arranged by Special Collections and curated by students from HISP 3231 and Irina Popescu's Latin American Feminisms course.

In addition, the library's archival holdings have been significantly enhanced by a recent gift, the collection of Jonathan Cilley, a graduate of Bowdoin's famous class of 1825. Cilley (1802-1838) was a skilled orator, lawyer, and United States Representative from Maine (1836-1838), who died from a gunshot wound following a <u>duel</u> with fellow congressman William Graves of Kentucky. The collection includes hundreds of letters between Cilley and his wife, Deborah,

including the last letter he wrote (which failed to mention he would be dueling the next day). The Cilley Family Papers also includes material related to Jonathan Prince Cilley (Bowdoin Class of 1858), a Bvt. Brig. Gen. during the Civil War; Jonathan Prince Cilley, Jr. (Bowdoin Class of 1891); and Jonathan Cilley Tibbitts (Bowdoin Class of 1922). Bowdoin & The Book seeks to elevate conversations about the "book," broadly defined to extend from oral traditions to manuscripts, printed books, and digital media, to serve as the conduit for an exploration of the intersections of history, technology, culture, language, literature, and more through Special Collections & Archives' rare book collections. Under the auspices of the program this semester, students engaged with the book form in over 40 class sessions in the SC&A Learning Lab, faculty and staff traveled to the Boston Antiquarian Book Fair, and we welcomed book designer Ken Botnick for a lecture on haptic learning and sponsored a hands-on paper-marbling workshop for students.






