Bowdoin is now a member of the <u>Center for Research</u> <u>Libraries</u> (CRL), providing the community with increased

access to a wealth of primary sources through Interlibrary Loan, including the largest circulating collection of newspapers in North America, more than 38,000 journals and 800,000 international dissertations, and major microfilm and paper collections from Africa, Latin America, the Middle East, Europe, South Asia, and Southeast Asia.
